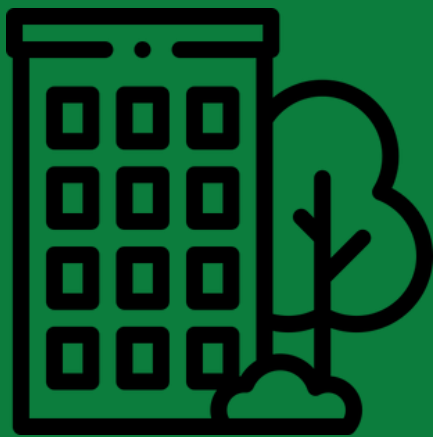
This was the amount of money spent by the Benevolent Fund supporting former UDR Veterans and their dependent families in need

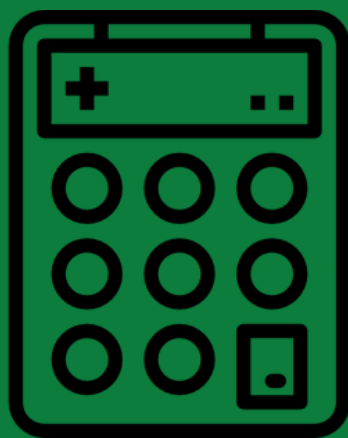
This was the number of families or groups who benefitted from a respite break at Ringhaddy House Apartment Complex which is available free of charge

The Regiment merged with the Royal Irish Rangers in 1992, which means that The UDR Benevolent Fund may be needed for the next 30 to 40 years



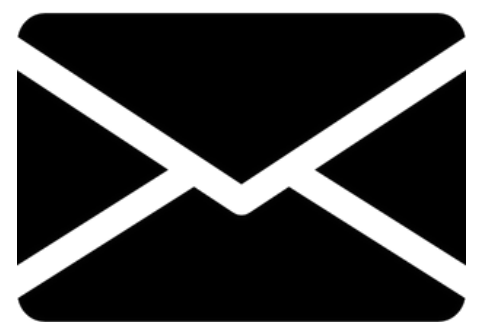
